Whitetail Postseason To-Do List

Post Season Gear Check:

- 1. Thoroughly clean your bow or gun, wax your bow strings and remove oxidation from from all metal
- 2. Your clothes have taken a beating during the season. Wash your clothes in scent eliminating detergent and thoroughly dry and store them in an airtight container
- 3. Take care of your electronics—game cameras, range finders, headlamps etc... Remove batteries, clean the battery contacts and store in a dry place
- 4. Gear inevitably breaks or just needs upgraded. This time of year is great for finding sales to replace gear on a bargain

Post Season Land Access:

- 1. Start planning next year's hunts
- 2. Investigate opportunities to expand your land access in state an out of state
 - a. Is a land lease the right option
 - Getting access still works the old fashioned way too—knocking on doors asking permission
 - c. Look onto public lands you've not investigated or hunted

Post Season Land Assessment:

- 1. Asses what habitat enhancements could be made on your hunting property and make a plan for your updates
- 2. Put your trail cameras back to work and start figuring out what bucks made it through hunting season
- 3. Late winter/early spring is a great time to get out and do some scouting, especially if you have a lite snow to show areas of high traffic
- 4. Late winter/early spring is a great opportunity to locate new stand locations and clear shooting lanes
- 5. Shed hunt...go find the leftover bone from this season to help determine what bucks will be around next fall

Increase Your Accuracy:

- 1. Joining a club is a great way to stay connected to the sport and get the competitive juices flowing
- 2. Go to a local archery range and talk shop with some of the staff. They're a great source of information, and most love to share their knowledge
- 3. Practice at home in your backyard, at elevation if possible
- 4. Do what you love and sharpen your accuracy by hunting small game
